As our State, County, and Local leaders respond to the constantly changing effects of COVID-19, the Woodville Police Department remains committed to keeping our Village safe. We are operational and fully staffed at this time.

For emergencies, continue to call 9-1-1. Non-emergencies call 419-849-2211.

The following procedures will be implemented regarding non-emergency calls for service and reports being filed until further notice.

- The lobby of the Police Station is open 24/7. Any visitors to the lobby will be limited to one person inside at a time.
- All non-emergency calls requesting an officer will be screened and may be handled by an officer over the phone.
- Responding police officers will limit their exposure during responses to non-emergency calls. Reporting persons/complainants will be requested to meet officers outside of their residence or current location. The officers will offer further direction to reporting persons/complainants.

WATER TREATMENT PLANT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

The Village of Woodville's Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Improvement project is well underway!

The demolition phase continues, while new equipment is arriving daily. You may have already noticed the new CO2 tank, and arriving soon will be the tallest, and most noticeable addition – a new lime silo! Many other skilled trades are hard at work painting, plumbing, and installing the new electric.

We are optimistic that by the end of June the WTP process will resume typical operations. While you may have noticed a significant increase in the hardness level in the water, this change is only temporary through the end of the project. Although the water quality is not what you are familiar with, please know the water is safe to consume, bathe/ shower, and cook with.

Water tests are performed daily at the WTP and in the community for chlorine and hardness. Adjustments are made to chlorine to ensure Woodville meets OEPA's required levels to the farthest points in the village.

Please don't hesitate to call us should you have any concerns regarding your water.
