




FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR - KEITH KRUSE

Vegetation Site - The Village operates a Vegetation Site located on Port Clinton Road for the use of village residents ONLY. This site is for grass clippings, shrub and tree trimmings, and leaves. Wood, construction materials and concrete are not allowed. The compost material and/or mulch chippings are free to village residents. We have recently added cameras, if you notice any misuse, or non-residents using the vegetation site, please contact the Village office at 419-849-3031.

Hydrant Flushing - Begins the week of October 7th and continues until all hydrants have been flushed. Residents may experience temporary low water pressure and/or water discoloration. Should you continue to have persistent problems as mentioned above, please contact the Water Department at 419-849-3031.

Eagle Scout Projects - An Eagle Scout Service Project "Eagle Project" is the opportunity for a Boy Scout to demonstrate leadership of others while performing a project for the benefit of his community. This is the peak of the Scout's leadership training, and it requires a significant effort on his part.

In 2017, then Boy Scout Joe Emerine had a vision for his Eagle Project - the development of the public grounds where the Limelite Theatre had been demolished. Joe began with Phase I, a concrete sidewalk connecting Main St. to the Village Parking Lot. With Council's blessing, Joe also created a sign dubbing the area Limelite Eagle Park! In 2019, Boy Scouts Nathan SedImeier and Aidan Cable continued with Phases II & III, respectively. Nathan added a concrete patio area with picnic benches. Finishing touches were finalized by Aidan with the installation of 45 ton of river rock stone creating a dry river bed that runs throughout the park, plus 180 plants and shrubs. (All three Scouts have, or will receive, the highest rank of Eagle Scout)

This year Trail Marker Park also benefited from an Eagle Project. Caleb O'Connor earned his Eagle Scout rank for planting three trees along the riverbank in the Park. The trees have been planted in an order so that the first letter of the common tree names (Bald Cypress, Swamp White Oak, and Autumn Splendor Buckeye) will stand for BSA or Boy Scouts of America.

Please check out the hard work accomplished by these fine young men, and their crews, for the benefit of our village. Congratulations on a job well done!

Veteran Banners Project - The banners that are currently hanging will be taken down for the winter after Veteran's Day (Nov. 11th). Due to an overwhelming demand, the committee has decided to have another Veteran Banner campaign next year. Details will be advertised at a later date.
