Thank you to our Council, employees, volunteers of various committees, residents, and the business community. The current condition of various street lawn (boulevard) areas has raised several concerns. We have started the process to update village ordinances regarding vehicle parking on the boulevard areas. We continue to explore the demolition of the Temple Furniture building on Main Street. By combining our resources with the Woodville Community & Business Association, and possible grant opportunities, it is our goal to develop a small park with a pathway to connect the Main Street businesses and the village parking lot. I look forward to the New Year, and I wish all of you a happy and healthy 2012.

FROM THE POLICE CHIEF ~ ROY WHITEHEAD

I am happy to say that the New Year has started off on a good note so far, we have had more rain than snow! As we all know the snow will be flying and accumulating soon, so please keep the following in mind over the next few months:

SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS:

- Level 1** - Roads (township and county, mainly secondary) are hazardous with the possibility of blowing and drifting snow. Roads are icy and drivers should use caution, if they choose to drive.
 - Level 2** - Roads are hazardous (including primary roads) with blowing and drifting snow a possibility. Only those who feel it is necessary to drive should be on these roadways. Employees should contact their employers to see if they should report to work.
 - Level 3** - Roads are closed to all non-essential personnel. No one should be out during these conditions unless it is absolutely necessary to travel. All employees should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Those traveling on any roadway in the county may subject themselves to citation or arrest.
- If there is a snow emergency in effect it will be announced on local news and radio stations, at which time we will be asking the residents to not park on the streets so the plow crew can do their job.**

Did you know that the Village of Woodville has a partnership with Efficiency Smart to bring the benefits of energy efficiency to its residents and businesses? The program offers technical assistance and financial incentives directly to the Village of Woodville customers to help reduce the cost of making energy-efficient improvements.

Woodville's residential utility customers have access to a broad range of incentives through the Efficiency Smart program, including:

- Discounts of up to 85 % off the purchase of compact fluorescent light bulbs.
- \$50 rebates on the purchase of qualified Energy Star® refrigerators or high-efficiency clothes washers.
- \$35 incentives for recycling up to three secondary working refrigerators and/or freezers through the free appliance recycling initiative.
- Electric meter loan program to help renters and homeowners measure their electric usage to identify areas for savings.

In addition to the residential services noted above, Woodville's business utility customers also have a variety of energy efficiency options available to them through Efficiency Smart's prescriptive and custom programs.
