As you organize your spring and summer calendars, prepare a plan in the event of a tornado or severe weather. The Village will sound a siren for 3 steady minutes if a tornado has been spotted in the area. There is NO all clear signal. When weather does become threatening, tune in to local TV or radio for more information.

Friendly reminders...

- According to **Codified Ordinance 521.5** you must immediately remove feces deposited by your animals on public or private property not owned by you.
- During Garage Sales, **signs may not be placed in the boulevard, on public property, on utility poles or on private property without the property owners approval.**
- Keep your homes, windows and vehicles locked when unattended.
- **LOOK TWICE-SAVE A LIFE!!** May is motorcycle awareness month - always be aware of two wheeled vehicles on the roads.

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR - KEITH KRUSE

After a pleasantly mild winter, spring is here and the sewer separation construction crews will be back in action. Their agenda will be to complete the road paving, work on restoration and lift station improvements. We anticipate the completion of the project by the end of May. A detailed letter will be sent to property owners with information on how to complete the sewer tie in process.

If you have green netting on your property it may be removed and disposed of with your regular trash pick up. The netting should be bagged and placed curbside. These areas should also be mowed and maintained.

The Ohio Utilities Protection Service along with Governor Kasich recently declared April as "Safe Dig Month." This is to remind Ohio's residents to call before digging to avoid damaging underground pipelines, wires and cables. "Know What's Below...Call 811 Before You Dig." DID YOU KNOW...

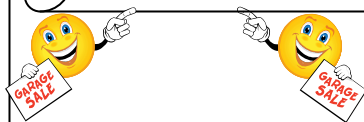
