Former Woodville resident Robert “Bud” Marisay, and his wife Virginia raise the Flight 93 Flag in H.W. Busdiecker Park (Flag Park) to honor his sister, Georgine Marisay Corrigan, and the other hero’s of Flight 93.

Georgine switched flights when she checked in at the airport early the morning of September 11, 2001 in the hopes of getting home sooner. Ms. Corrigan, an antiques and collectables dealer, was returning home to Hawaii, after attending an antique show in Massachusetts. On that plane were many Americans who at the last minute changed their flights. The Village will honor Ms. Corrigan’s memory, along with those other heroic passengers who lost their lives in Shanksville, PA, by raising the commemorative Flight 93 Flag annually during the 4th of July Celebration and on Patriot Day – 9/11. On all other days the Flag will be proudly displayed, in Council Chambers, as a tribute for the 33 Americans we lost on Flight 93.

School resumes August 28th– Keeping children safe in designated school zones is our top priority. FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR - KEITH KRUSE

Sewer Separation Project update: The main line construction is complete, however, there is much to be done before the Project is complete. One component of the final phase of the project, and perhaps the most complex, is restoration. We ask for your continued support and patience as every effort is made to restore the community to its original condition. Another portion of the final phase is the verification that all sanitary services have been replaced and/or connected into the new sanitary system by the June 15, 2013 deadline. A detailed letter regarding property owner’s responsibilities to replace and/or connect into the new sanitary system was mailed in mid June. If you did not receive this information, please contact our office.

The Village was recently awarded grant money for the Port Clinton Road Pump Station Project. The total project cost is \$620,735 and we will receive a grant for 50% of that, or \$310,368. The balance qualifies for a 0% interest loan for 20yrs. We are currently working with Poggemeyer Design Group and the Ohio Public Works Commission to apply for additional monies to reduce the remaining balance.

A new “Municipal Building” sign will be purchased with the annual Ottawa-Seneca-Sandusky (OSS) Solid Waste District funding money of \$3,000. The sign will replace the current Utilities Building sign at 530 Lime Street.

Be on alert for bill-paying scam targeting utility customers

According to an alert issued by the American Public Power Association, municipal utilities and their customers should be on the lookout for a multi-state scam making its way across the country.

The scam aims to steal payments and identity information using in-person solicitation, social media, fliers, phone calls and text messages. Scammers have been targeting utility customers throughout the U.S., with victims reported in California, Illinois, Tennessee, Texas and Florida.

Memphis Light, Gas and Water estimates about 1,000 customers have been victimized by the scam, said Communications & PR Supervisor Glen Thomas. Florida Power & Light Company reports that about 4,500 customers have fallen victim.

The Better Business Bureau reports that under the scam, con artists posing as utility company representatives are telling customers that President Obama has approved special funding through the Federal Reserve Bank for utility bill assistance. No such funding program exists.

Scammers are asking customers for personal information, such as Social Security identification numbers, through automated phone calls, in person door-to-door visits, and online solicitation. They then provide victims with a fraudulent bank routing number for them to pay their utility bills. Anyone with information regarding this scam should contact local law enforcement authorities.

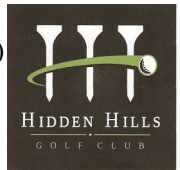
