FROM THE VILLAGE...

◇ **SNOW REMOVAL - Codified Ordinance 521.14:**

The owner or occupant of any premises within the limits of the Village shall within twenty-four (24) hours of the end of any substantial snowfall, remove all snow or dirt from the sidewalk, in front of the premises, owned or occupied by them. Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

◇ **SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS:**

Level 1 - Roads (township and county, mainly secondary) are hazardous with the possibility of blowing and drifting snow. Roads are icy and drivers should use caution, if they choose to drive.

Level 2 - Roads are hazardous (including primary roads) with blowing and drifting snow a possibility. Only those who feel it is necessary to drive should be on these roadways. Employees should contact their employers to see if they should report to work.

Level 3 - Roads are closed to all non-essential personnel. No one should be out during these conditions unless it is absolutely necessary to travel. All employees should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Those traveling on any roadway in the county may subject themselves to citation or arrest.

If there is a snow emergency in effect it will be announced on local news and radio stations, at which time we will be asking the residents to not park on the streets so the plow crew can do their job.

◇ **NEW ORDINANCE PASSED:**

◇ **SEWER SEPARATION PROJECT:**

January will mark the half way point for having your sewer tied into the new system. A letter will be sent out in January as a reminder to each property owner. At this time there will be no exceptions to the June 15, 2013 deadline.

If you had sidewalks removed this fall due to the sewer separation project, the contractor will be back in the spring to replace them. Please call the Utilities Department at 419-849-3031 if you notice that there is a need for more stone in the removed sidewalk area.

IMPORTANT FACTS TO CONSIDER BEFORE PURCHASING SPACE HEATERS...

Advertisements promise that certain models of electric space heaters will save 50 percent on heating costs. Many may wonder if this and other claims are true. In fact, depending on how portable heaters are used, consumers actually can see their total energy costs go up. The promises of whole-house comfort from portable electric space heaters are exaggerated.

Spot, or zone, heating is what portable electric heaters were designed to do. If a portable heater is used in one area and the thermostat for the main heating system is lowered, energy savings are possible. However, if a portable heater is used in one room and the main heating system also is running, savings are not likely to be achieved.

So, how much will an electric space heater cost to operate? You can use the following formula to calculate how much it will cost to operate one 1,500-watt space heater: Watts x hours of use ÷ 1,000 x cost per kilowatt-hour = cost of operation.

This means that if a 1,500-watt heater ran 24-hours at a rate of 7.5 cents a kilowatt-hour (the village residential rate), the cost would be **\$2.70 a day** (1,500 x 24 ÷ 1,000 x \$0.075). For a month that would amount to \$81.00 added to the electric bill of the average customer.

When buying and using an electric space heater, please follow these safety guidelines.

- Look for a product that carries an Underwriters Lab (UL) label.
- Select one that automatically shuts off if tipped and that has protective casing over the heating element to avoid the potential for burns.
- Avoid using an extension cord but, if one is needed, be sure it has at least 12-gauge wire.
- Select the proper wattage so your portable electric space heater doesn't overload your electrical wiring and create a fire safety issue.
- Select a model that has a thermostat so it doesn't run all the time.

Never allow an electric space heater to run when you are out of the house or asleep.
