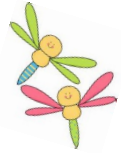

FROM THE VILLAGE OFFICIALS...

- ◆ We appreciate your patience and understanding concerning the "misplaced" February utility bills. We are working with the United States Post Office Consumer Affairs Division to explore the details of this matter. Please contact the utility billing office immediately if you do not receive your utility bill by the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month.
- ◆ As many of you have already noticed, the February 2013 edition of the CenturyLink telephone book contains many errors. CenturyLink has advised the Village they will publish a revised book, with an explanation regarding the error in the front of the book.
- ◆ The purchase of the Temple Furniture building (Limelite Theatre) is very close to becoming a certainty. When this is finalized, Village Officials will host a Public Meeting to allow residents an opportunity to share their ideas regarding the development of the area.
- ◆ Sandusky County Emergency Alert System - This notification system enables the County to provide residents with critical information quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuation of buildings or neighborhoods. You will receive time-sensitive messages wherever you specify, such as your home, cell, or business phone, email, text messages, hearing impaired receiving devices, and more. You pick where, you pick how. We encourage everyone to sign up. To register visit [www.sandusky-county.org](http://www.sandusky-county.org) and click on the Citizens Alert System tab. Individuals with disabilities that need assistance can register by calling Alert System Administrator at 419-334-6102.
- ◆ Just a reminder the June 15, 2013 deadline for connecting sanitary sewers to the new system is fast approaching. All sanitary waste must go into the new sanitary line and storm can go into the "old" system. *Thank you* to those who have already completed their connections. Permits are required to be on file, for your sewer separation. This includes tie-ins and/or the televising of lines, it is the property owners responsibility to complete and return this permit to the Village. Having this information for the sewer on your property will be a valuable tool for future reference.
- ◆ Address Visibility - Please make sure your address and/or apartment letter/numbers are clearly visible from the street. This will help village workers, fire and police departments to properly identify your address in the case of an emergency.

SWAP - WHAT IT IS AND HOW YOU CAN HELP...

The Village of Woodville is working along with Ohio EPA to deliver a plan of action for protecting the water you drink from contamination at the source. As many of you may know our drinking water is pumped out of the ground by numerous wells in wellfields located on the north side of State Route 20. This ground water is then pumped to the water treatment plant where the water goes through a series of filters to remove the heavy particles after which chlorine is added to kill harmful bacteria that may be in it. From that point it is pumped through an underground network of pipes to our homes and businesses. All ground water originally comes from rain or melted snow that has seeped into the ground. Where underground water is abundant enough to provide an adequate source of drinking water, the water-rich sediments or rocks are called an aquifer. As ground water does not stay in one place, the northwest Ohio's ground water primarily flows towards Lake Erie. This means that if pollutants are spilled on the ground anywhere near the wells, or south or west of the wells, they may eventually enter the ground water you are drinking. To assist the Village with our drinking water source protection efforts, Ohio EPA has provided a Drinking Water Source Assessment report. The report includes a map of the protection area, based on calculations of how water travels through the aquifer in five years, and also information on land uses and facilities that may pose a contamination risk to the drinking water source. The Village has used the provided assessment to develop a drinking water sources protection plan. ## TRASH PICK-UP REMINDER...

As per Village Codified Ordinance 951.04

- (a) No person shall cause or allow trash, garbage, rubbish, refuse or any other noxious or offensive materials or substances to be placed upon his/her premises or place of business or residence for purpose of refuse pickup earlier than 5pm on the day immediately preceding a scheduled refuse collection day.
- (b) Anyone violating this section will be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense and not more than two hundred (\$200.00) for each subsequent offense.  
(Ordinance 10-88. Passes 6-13-88)
