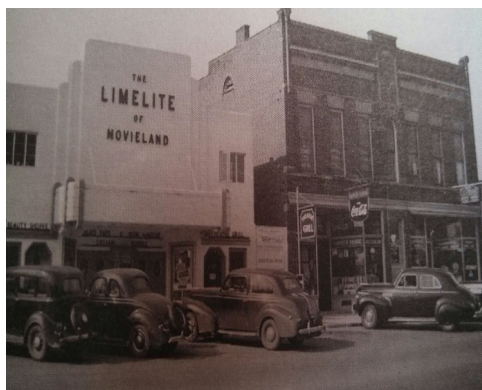

FROM THE VILLAGE OFFICIALS...

Woodville lost a piece of notable history in Trail Marker Park, due to strong winds from a storm in late August. A Hackberry Tree, used by Native Americans to navigate trails and shallow crossings in the Portage River, had extensive damage. Native Americans would bend tree saplings to create an L-shape trunk which would mark the direction of the trail along the river banks.

Woodville Historical President, Michael O'Connor stated that years ago the tree was bolted together in an effort to preserve its statue. According to historians this tree is the

last trail marker tree in Northwest Ohio. A plaque remains in Trail Marker Park to tell Woodville residents, and park visitors, the amazing story of the Hackberry Tree in Trail Marker Park.



In May of this year the Village of Woodville acquired, by Forfeiture of Lands from the Sandusky County Auditor, the Temple Ministry Building (formerly the Limelite Theatre) 129 East Main Street. Paul Pontius built the theatre, and there was standing room only on November 15, 1939 for the first film UNDER PUP, starring Gloria Jean. Mr. Pontius decided to locate in Woodville after an aerial survey revealed that Woodville was a midway point for the surrounding communities.

George Weekly bought the 450 seat theatre in the 1950's and offered Spanish language films twice a week. Al Tolento, and later Marciano Guerrero, Jr. took over the business and continued with Spanish films. The last film shown was in the early 1980's.

In 1968 David Bessman started a furniture business called LIGHT MINISTRY, which he continued until his passing several years ago. Mr. Bessman had no beneficiaries, and therefore, with no maintenance, the building's condition continues to deteriorate, and now must be demolished.

The demolition has been scheduled to begin the week of September 30, 2013. The exact date will be posted on the signboard at the Post Office.

Village Officials and the Woodville Business and Community Association (WBCA) will host several Public Meeting's to receive residents idea's on the future development of the area. Dates for the Public Meeting's will be noticed in the Suburban Press, and on the bottom portion of your utility bill.

Village Codified Ordinance Section 711 regarding: Door to Door Salesman, Peddler, Canvasser, or Solicitor

For your safety, please ask any unfamiliar person(s) at your door for identification (license/permit issued by Woodville Police Department), before you allow them to enter your home, or call the police department at 419-849-3020 and request an officer to verify the license/permit.

Below are a few of the rules and regulations regarding soliciting in the Village. The entire ordinance can be found online at www.conwaygreene.com/woodville.htm or contact the police department to request a copy.

- ◇ Applicants for licenses under this chapter must file with the Police Chief a sworn application.
- ◇ The licensing provisions of this chapter shall not apply to a person making delivery of goods, wares or merchandise theretofore sold by an establishment having a permanent place of business; or to a person soliciting the purchase of goods, wares, merchandise or gifts for or on behalf of any educational, civic, religious or charitable organization.
- ◇ All business done under a license issued under this chapter shall be conducted between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. weekdays. No business shall be conducted on Saturday, Sunday or on the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, or Christmas Day.
- ◇ Any licensee engaged in business within the Village shall carry the license and shall produce it for examination whenever requested by any police officer or by any prospective purchaser.
- ◇ No peddler, canvasser, or solicitor shall knock at the door or ring the bell of any private home, apartment or apartment building in the Village where there is displayed at the entrance a notice reading "No Soliciting" or which otherwise clearly purports to prohibit persons from doing so, unless the person is or has been invited upon such premises by the owner, lessee or occupant thereof.
- ◇ No peddlers, solicitor or canvasser shall vex, annoy or harass any person by importuning such person to purchase or to look at his goods or wares; nor shall any peddler, solicitor or canvasser enter any private house or residence without being invited to come in.

Please contact the Woodville Police Department immediately if you have any questions or issues concerning any door to door solicitor.

Arbor Day Foundation Names Woodville Tree City USA

Woodville, Ohio was named Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management. This is the 22nd year Woodville has earned the national designation.

Woodville achieved Tree City USA recognition by meeting the program's four requirements; a tree board or department, a tree-care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

The Tree City USA program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation, in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters.

"Trees bring shade to our homes and beauty to our neighborhoods, along with numerous economic, social and environmental benefits," said John Rosenow, founder and chief executive of the Arbor Day Foundation.
