For your safety make sure to ask unfamiliar persons at your door for proper identification before allowing them into your home. In 2007, Village Council passed ORD 711 which requires solicitors to obtain a license that permits them to go door to door. Solicitors can only do this after registering with the Police Chief and receiving a Village Photo ID. All ID cards issued shall be worn by the solicitor.

Also keep in mind that school is out for the summer, so please pay extra attention while driving around town. Parents please remind your children about bicycle safety, wearing a helmet while riding bikes, and looking before crossing streets. Let's keep our streets safe and our children safer.

To keep you updated on our ongoing projects, completion of the raw waterline project will come to a close as soon as the weather allows the contractor to finish the restoration work and the access road. The well field expansion project will be unfolding before our eyes as the projected start date will be August or September. The long awaited combined sewer separation project will kick off with the bid opening on June 29th. A recommendation for the bid award to Council will put the project in motion, as most of the details are already in place to move forward. According to our engineer, construction could possibly begin sometime in September.

In the coming weeks the Village employees will be making preparations for the annual 4th of July celebration. Please watch for details on your utility bill for hydrant flushing dates. 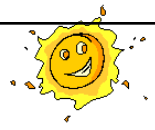
## FROM THE FIRE CHIEF - PAUL HEINEMAN
