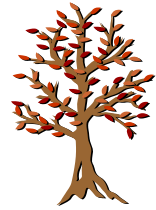

PUBLIC NOTICE

Due to maintenance work at the Water Treatment Plant, the softening process will need to be bypassed; this will cause hard water. This work is scheduled to begin on September 20th and should last until September 24th.

A few things to know about hard water are:

- IT IS SAFE TO DRINK
- It may have an odor
- There may be some discoloration
- It may require more soap/detergents for laundry, dishes, personal use, etc.



In preparation for this project, the water tower will be full so depending on where you live in the village the hard water may not hit your location until later in the week and could possibly run into the next week due to getting the softening process back up and running, then out in the system. The Village has installed pedestrian crossing signs at the corner of Lime and W. First Street. Please encourage your child to cross Lime Street at that intersection as they walk to and from school.

The Red Ribbon Week Campaign will kick off on October 23rd and run through the 31st this year. The goal of the Campaign will be to involve families, schools, businesses, churches, local government, and law enforcement in all aspects of the campaign and establish an atmosphere that supports awareness, education, and on going initiatives to prevent illegal drug use.

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR - BOB RICKARD

I have had the pleasure of being involved in many changes and projects throughout the Village such as the new water treatment plant built in 1984, sewer treatment plant and lift station expansion, waterline loops and extensions, Flag Park – the flagpoles and pond, new utilities building, new substation and distribution circuits, new 12" water improvement, downtown revitalization project, two new subdivisions just to name a few. I will miss overseeing all the of the utilities for the village and the day to day contact with the Village employees, but the things that I will miss least is the stress and the work load. The Well Field Expansion project will be up and going soon, putting three new wells in behind the Utilities Building. The Village employees have been working on the closing of the pool for the season and before you know they will be gearing up the trucks and plows for the winter season. A few projects I would like to see finished before leaving are clarifier rehab and electric distribution line upgrade. My best wishes to my predecessor. It's has been nothing but an honor and a pleasure to have worked 35 years for the Village of Woodville.

FROM THE FIRE CHIEF—PAUL HEINEMAN LIME FEST. . .

Our fire hydrants will have a new look soon as the Boy Scouts have taken on the project of painting them. As set by the NFPA 291-13 the hydrants will now be color coded by the gallons per minute flow as indicated below:

- Green 1000/1400
- Orange 500/999
- Red 500 or less

Note: Blue indicates 1500 gallons per minute or more, at this time the Village has none.

This will help our firefighters to easily identify hydrants that are best for fighting fires! Our thanks goes out to the Boy Scouts for their help on this project.

The Fire Department also asks that you check your house number to see that is prominently displayed. This is very important when emergency services are responding to your location.

TREE COMMITTEE. . .

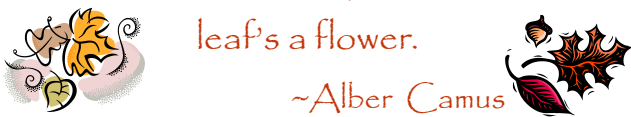
Just a reminder... the fall tree planting is just around the corner! Applications are available in the Clerk's office at Town Hall. Order deadline will be 10-10-10.
