FROM THE POLICE CHIEF - ROY WHITEHEAD

Winter is finally here! I once heard a saying, "Snowflakes are one of nature's most fragile things, but just look what they do when they stick together." Along with the cold weather we all know what that means for Northwest Ohio...snow! In your everyday and holiday driving, please keep in mind the following information.

SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS:

Level 1 - Roads (township and county, mainly secondary) are hazardous with the possibility of blowing and drifting snow. Roads are icy and drivers should use caution, if they choose to drive.

Level 2 - Roads are hazardous (including primary roads) with blowing and drifting snow a possibility. Only those who feel it is necessary to drive should be on these roadways. Employees should contact their employers to see if they should report to work.

Level 3 - Roads are closed to all non-essential personnel. No one should be out during these conditions unless it is absolutely necessary to travel. All employees should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Those traveling on any roadway in the county may subject themselves to citation or arrest.

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR - KEITH KRUSE

I am pleased to be taking on this new role as the Administrator for the Village of Woodville, having only been an employee of the Village for a year and a half, being selected for this position is truly an honor. Beginning in the new year, we will soon be getting underway with the Sanitary Sewer Improvements (SSI) project, there will be some final details to iron out with the engineers before we can schedule a final public meeting, we will keep you updated on a meeting place, date and time.

We are still in the process of completing the new well field, we hope to finish this project before the cold weather settles in. The village employees have made sure the trucks and plows are raring and ready to go when the snow starts to fly, also a few other things to remember:

- Village of Woodville Codified Ordinance 521.14, the owner or occupant of any premises within the limits of the Village shall within twenty-four hours of the end on any substantial snowfall, remove all snow from the sidewalk in front of the premises, owned or occupied by them.
- Snow emergencies will be determined in conjunction with the Sandusky County Sheriff's Department and the Woodville Police Department. When there is 2" or more of snow accumulation, we ask the residents to help us by moving their vehicle(s) off the streets, as this will allow us to do our job more efficiently.
- To know if the Village is under snow emergency, please tune in to your local TV stations, or the radio stations of Eagle 99, K100 and 101.5 The River for the most up to date information.
