Everyone, on some level, has had to evaluate and/ or modify their financial practices due to the current economic conditions. It has been a challenge to maintain our standards while prices soar, and funds continue to decline. The Village is no different, and will be facing major cuts in the Local Government Fund in 2012 and 2013, as well as the expiration of our current 7.4 mill operating levy. On May 3rd we ask for your support of a 7.4mill tax levy for 5 years. The levy supports the Villages current expenses, which includes Public Safety/Police, Street Improvements, Maintenance for all Village owned buildings, and the Parks/Recreation departments. This is a **RENEWAL**, which means **NO** increases in your taxes. Please feel free to contact myself, or any Council member, should you have any questions or concerns. Spring is **finally** here with summer right around the corner, this year will be challenging do to road closures and construction, however remember

- Construction crews will be in full swing, children, bikes, walkers, runners and construction workers will be out and about so please pay close attention to your surroundings
- Grass clippings may not be blown or mowed into the streets
- Animal feces on public or private property must be removed by the animal's owner
- Garage sale time – signs may not be placed in the boulevard, on public property, on utility poles or on private property without the property owners approval
- Register your bicycle - NOON–4 PM Monday-Friday – no charge
- Remember to keep your windows, homes, and vehicles locked when unattended
- May 23 – June 5 – State wide Click It or Ticket It
- May is motorcycle awareness month – always be aware of two wheeled vehicles on the roads

FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE UPDATED

Woodville Village Council completed review and approval of Ordinance 6-2011 on March 28,2011 as required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), to incorporate current requirements of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Direction and assistance with this update has been provided by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) in their role as NFIP State Coordinating Office. The updated information includes the Flood Insurance Study updated and effective April 18, 2011 and new digital flood insurance rate maps (DFIRMs) which supersede the old maps effective April 18, 2011. This flood damage prevention information is used for flood plain administration in the Village. The updated information was created and is provided in a digital format that can be more easily accessed by the community. FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR - KEITH KRUSE

After a slow start due to the weathers lack of cooperation, the Sewer Separation Improvements are progressing rapidly. The first phase has moved onto the side streets installing the main trunk lines. The second phase was started the week of March 21st and this crew will be keeping a tight schedule. We have received many compliments on the professionalism and cleanliness of Underground Utilities and their operation.

Many contactors have already met with us to review regulations for the project. If your contractor does not have an informational packet, they may pick one up in the Town Hall lobby, the Utilities Department office, or download it from our website. Included in the packet is a Sanitary Sewer Tap Permit form. This form must be completed by the contractor, approved by a Village Representative, and sign by the property owner.

If due to construction Buckeye Sanitation is not able to pick up your trash on Thursday, it will be picked up on Friday. To be placed on the Friday pick up list, or any other questions or concerns, please call the Utilities Office at 419-849-3031.

The Woodville Branch of the Birchard Public Library will place a 1-mil, 5year levy on the May 3rd ballot. This levy is for operating expenses, it is the first operating levy in the 74 year history of the Woodville Library. Funding from the State, for libraries, has been cut 30% and is expected to be cut an additional 5%. These cuts will affect hours of operation, services, and book purchases.
