FROM THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR ~ KEITH KRUSE

We would like to **THANK YOU** for your patience and understanding during the Sewer Separation Project, Asphalt Repaving, as well as, the Columbia Gas Pipeline Restoration, all of which have been progressing simultaneously throughout the Village. According to the progress schedule from the Sewer Project contractor, Underground Utilities, Inc., the project is about 6 months ahead of schedule. The restoration process will begin the middle of September. This process will include, lateral cuts in the boulevard areas prepared for re-seeding, many curb cuts repaired, and numerous streets repaved on the north side of Main Street. The sewer relining phase on Water Street, along the river, is moving forward as planned.

Residents will be notified, as each phase is complete, of the date they will be expected to have their sewer tied/tapped- in to the new sewer. Underground Utilities has been doing a great job, and we have had a very positive response from residents about their performance. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns you may have.

The Village has been fortunate again this year to be awarded Local Grant monies:

- Ottawa-Sandusky-Seneca Counties Solid Waste District: Funding for new rule signs for the swimming pool, diving board, and slide. All signs were made from recycled plastic. Total project \$1,661.
- ODNR's NatureWorks Program: Funding to replace the roof on the old street garage, as well as, the roof and cupola on the gazebo shelter house. \$6,112
- Sandusky County Parks grant program: Funding for a shade structure at the pool. \$1,695

New sidewalk lighting has been installed in Busdiecker Park. The new lights emulate the downtown street lights. I encourage you to visit the pool and parks to check out the latest additions.

FROM THE POLICE CHIEF ~ ROY WHITEHEAD JUST OPENED

• The Woodville Police Department along with Prevention Partnership Coalition and The Sandusky County Health Department would like to inform you that we have a drop box for prescription drugs in our office. The purpose for this box is to get expired, unwanted or unused medications out of your homes to help protect your family. We take any medication, excluding liquid and over-the-counter medications. Also no syringes are to be placed in the box. If you wish to take part in this Medication Take Back, simply black out all personal information on the original package and bring them to the Police Station Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 AM and 4 PM. Give the medications to an officer who will then place them in the disposal box. If there are any questions about this program feel free to contact Officer Richards at 419-849-2211.
